

Cautious Optimism

Friends of TVCOG,

Troja est open (Troy is open!). So is the Tech Valley Center of Gravity!

As most of you know, the COG is fully operational and all members are welcome in the facility to work or play (while following our Covid-19 policies). We want to thank you again for your support during the height of the pandemic, supporting our short- and long term sustainability by paying monthly dues and donations. Our reopening would not be possible without your support.

In Rensselaer County, New York, 70,231 people (44.3%) have received at least one vaccine dose and 49,498 (31.2%) are fully vaccinated. The statewide positivity rate is 2.39% as of April 26th—its lowest since before the holiday season of 2020. The Capital Region's 7-day positivity rate is steadily around 1.7 percent. With these rates, we have started to see Troy gaining some more forward momentum. We're excited to see more new members joining the CoG and more folks walking the fair streets of historic Downtown Troy.

We're also excited about the return of in-person programming here at the COG. For children's events, we're dipping a toe in the water by joining in on the district-wide event, Troja Est Open, for May's outdoor Steam-Powered Saturday, and providing a virtual offering in addition. For adults, we are keeping the majority of our large events virtual (e.g Social Night, Member Meetings, Food for Thought, and Hatched) but we are also starting to offer small size classes. By limiting in-person classes to 3 participants maximum, and expanding the offerings for our one-on-one Quick Start Guide classes, we are able to ensure safely social distanced class options for everyone. We will continue to monitor pandemic conditions as decisions are made regarding indoor gatherings and update accordingly.

We encourage you to safely utilize the Center of Gravity as much as you like and join us this weekend for Troja Est Open.

Queenship Game Studio Awarded DEC Community Arts Grant

Queenship Game Studio is a Troy-based MWBE-qualified game studio making games about mental health, social interaction, and relationship building. Sponsored by the Tech Valley Center of Gravity, the Queenship team was awarded a DEC Community Arts Grant for their in-production title "The Shadowcross: A Tale of Inner Darkness," an RPG about dark emotional states and the importance of community. This non-combative video game features a traveler who must make their way by successfully navigating the landscape of Gravewood and speaking with and learning about its residents - in order to avoid succumbing to the shadow within.

Troja Est Open! Celebration in Downtown Troy

On Saturday May 1, Downtown Troy will offer socially-distanced and responsible outdoor spectacles. The "Troja Est Open" event will kick off at 11 a.m at River Street Market with an unveiling of a modern "Trojan Horse." The horse, handcrafted by Danny Killion of Weathered Wood, will remain on display at River Street Market until noon, and then complete a promenade to Riverfront Park, adjacent to the Troy Waterfront Farmers Market and up to and along River Street, Monument Square and Broadway, where stores will have sidewalk sales and specials. Bars will be open, with ample outdoor seating, and will each serve a signature "Enjoy Troy Cocktail." The day's events will culminate in a choreographed drone light show over the Hudson after dark. 
News from the Manufacturing Incubator

Small Moments, Big Impact

As an Incubator, we're more than just a mentorship program for startups (the Manufacturing Incubator). All that the CoG encompasses, from our equipment to our network of makers, helps to incubate and grow new businesses, manufacturing and otherwise. This month, we've welcomed some new business members who are excited to have access to our Formlabs 3B and Stratasys F270 3D printers. But more than the impressive flashy equipment, what inspires me the most are the small moments - when an employee stops in for five minutes to print a form (because who owns a printer these days?), uses our laser cutter to make a simple jig, holds a Zoom interview in our Board Room, or welds a metal part back together that would have cost hundreds to replace. As small as these moments may be, the small moments add up, showcasing how big of an impact we can have in helping businesses focus on what they do best.

STEAM-Powered Saturday is Tomorrow: Virtual and In-Person!


This month, we will be joining in the very special "Troja Est Open!" event taking place in downtown Troy, with a hybrid version of STEAM-Powered Saturday! On May 1st, we will be offering both an in-person activity from 10am-1pm, and a video tutorial, which will premiere on our Facebook page at noon.



Troja Est Open!

This activity will feature miniature, 3-dimensional laser-cut wooden Trojan horses for children to assemble, decorate and take home, inspired by the Trojan Horse created for the day's festivities. The "STEAM-Powered Saturday: Troja Est Open" event will also feature a battle robots demonstration and offer the opportunity to try them out!

This activity will take place on a drop-in basis from 10am-1pm on May 1st. Our event tent will be located outside on Broadway in downtown Troy, across from TVCOG. Masks and social distancing are required. Attendees will be asked to provide their contact tracing information, as per NYS outdoor event regulations.



Exploring 3D Design!

This month's virtual project is "Exploring 3D Design!" The video will take you behind the scenes of the designing and laser cutting process for the Trojan horses we made for STEAM-Powered Saturday: Troja Est Open! Then we will walk you through designing your very own 3D design project using TinkerCad, a free online software.

The video will premiere at noon on May 1 on our Facebook page, and will be available to view anytime afterwards. This particular activity does not require any supplies, but Trojan horse project kits will be available for pickup throughout the month at Bard and Baker Board Game Cafe starting on May 2.
